




















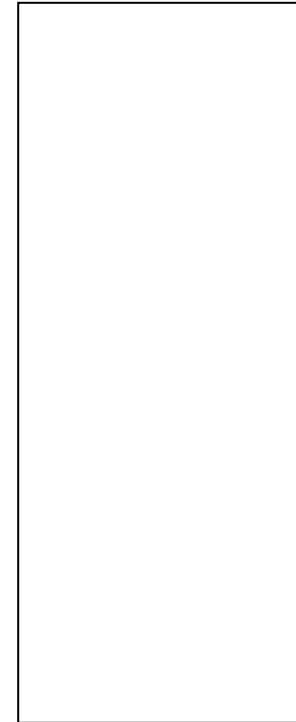

Cadets will have checked out of their rooms prior to Pass-In-Review, which is scheduled to begin at 9:30 am at the Flight Line. Following the Graduation Ceremony at 10:30, Cadets will be dismissed after all out-processing tasks have been completed. Do not plan to leave early, as the cadets cannot be dismissed until all closing tasks have been completed.

Plan to leave the base by 12:00 PM EDT, Saturday, 25 July 2009.

## Civil Air Patrol Great Lakes Region (North) Encampment 2009



### From the Commander

Parents:

Welcome to the 2009 Great Lakes Region (North) Encampment! My staff and I take great pride in the fact that our Encampment program has a superior reputation nationally within Civil Air Patrol, and that your son or daughter has chosen to become a part of that unparalleled experience! It is my hope that this week will prove rewarding for your cadet.

My duty as commander is to ensure the safety and well-being of your son or daughter during their week at Alpena. As a father of two, I know well the anxiety involved in leaving my children at any program away from home. I pledge that my staff and I will do our utmost to provide for your cadet's well-being throughout the week. Our command staff has a combined experience of over one hundred fifty encampments – you can rest assured that we will use that experience to provide the best possible environment and program for your cadet!

The preparation for this year's event has been uniquely challenging. The dynamics of the economy affect all parts of providing a program for over 250 young men and women; I am certain that the economy also factors in your preparation for this event as well. I am proud that we have been able to keep expenses to a minimum without compromising program quality. Working with our Air Force partners, we remain able to provide one of the best values for an 8-day Encampment in the nation. It remains our goal that no cadet shall be denied the ability to attend Encampment solely because of financial need. If you feel you need financial support, please read through the scholarships section, and we will work together with you to help find the support to get your cadet in the program.

There are several items that I'd like to highlight as you and your cadet prepare to attend. First, it is very important that all information on the medical history be completed as completely and honestly as possible. If your cadet has any medical conditions, allergies, or takes prescription medication, please take the time to note these. We are proud that our medical staff is comprised of only licensed EMTs, paramedics, and nurses, who can take care of most any routine medical matter on-site. While they are also trained to handle life-threatening emergencies, we are limited in the treatment we can provide to your cadet. CAP regulations require us to seek appropriate medical care beyond first aid and true emergency situations. If your cadet develops a serious problem, we will either transport them to Alpena General Hospital, or activate the local 911 system. In any emergency, we will be contact with you immediately. This is why your participation in completing this medical form is so very important. Rest assured that your cadet's medical information is treated as privileged information and will only be viewed by licensed medical personnel and adult command staff.

Second, In order to help your cadet succeed in his/her Encampment experience, we choose to limit items that may draw their focus away from training. That list is outlined later in this packet, and we ask your assistance in helping to enforce this. Your cadet may have access to his/her cell phone for outgoing calls during limited evening hours at the discretion of their immediate supervisor. At all other times, the cell phone will be locked in a secure area, and they will not be allowed to accept incoming calls.

Third, we take seriously the religious convictions of our cadets and staff. We provide worship opportunities during the week, and we ask that you make us aware of any religious requirements prior to attending so that our staff may best accommodate them.

Fourth, we realize that sometimes a cadet may have physical restrictions that limit their participation in Physical Training or other activities. If this is the case, please be sure to include a doctor's note with the application so that our medical staff can be aware and monitor your cadet's health and participation in all activities.

Finally, homesickness can be a problem during the week. Our experience has shown that the best cure for homesickness is to keep the cadet busy as much as possible. But we do understand that homesickness can be a challenge, particularly for first-time cadets. If your cadet should experience homesickness, we do have qualified and caring chaplains, as well as experienced staff to help them with any struggles. Sometimes, the best cure is a quick note of reassurance from you as parent or guardian. Your assistance and encouragement will go a long way towards helping your cadet get through the week, and sending or emailing letters is encouraged. We will have the capability of printing out small pictures as attachments. If you wish to mail your cadet a letter, I'd suggest sending it no later than Monday, and it should arrive in Alpena on Wednesday or Thursday. Emails will be printed and distributed once daily after dinner, and should arrive no later than 3:00 p.m. each day.

We are excited to have your cadet as a part of our team this summer! We know that this program will be challenging for your cadet. We also expect it will simultaneously be an opportunity for her/him to expand their horizons in leadership. Experience has shown us that the perseverance, commitment and camaraderie in the Encampment experience works to build the strength of character that will serve your son or daughter well not only in Civil Air Patrol, but also in daily life.

Thank you for allowing us the privilege of being a part of this important week in your cadet's Civil Air Patrol experience.

- Cost:** \$230 Basic Cadets, \$230 Seniors, \$240 CLS, \$295 Rocketry, \$75 SLS/CLC only.

Those families wishing to use a credit card for registration to pay for the encampment fees may do so (at an additional cost of \$7.00 to cover processing fees). Please follow the instructions at the encampment website at <http://encampment.miwg.cap.gov>. Remember to include your PayPal payment receipt with the application packet.

Registration after 01 July is \$275. After the application deadline has passed, the Encampment Command Team will determine if there is enough space for walk-in applicants. An announcement will be made via email and on the encampment web site at <http://encampment.miwg.cap.gov> **Walk-in procedures will be outlined on the web site ONLY IF sufficient space exists after applications meeting the deadline have been received and processed.**

**Scholarships:** Partial or full scholarships are available for *first time* cadets who cannot afford the cost of encampment. **No new cadet should miss the encampment for financial reasons.** All scholarship requests should be brought to the attention of Capt David Watts, Vice-commander at [ahrensfx@gmail.com](mailto:ahrensfx@gmail.com). Capt Watts will provide additional information that will allow us to evaluate how we can be of assistance on an equitable basis.

**Family Discounts:** CAP is a family-oriented organization. We are proud to be able to offer activities for every member of the family. Supporting this, we offer a \$10 cumulative discount for each additional family member attending encampment.

### Cadets who have NOT PREVIOUSLY attended an encampment may apply for:

**Basic Cadet Training:** An encampment can be the most significant and worthwhile training experience of a CAP cadet's membership. Training is what the encampment is all about. The encampment curriculum is integrated with the Air Force's development program. Cadets will receive instruction in the following training blocks: **Air Force Fundamentals** (Structure & Mission of the USAF, Aerospace Power, Aerospace Heritage), **Civil Air Patrol Fundamentals** (Emergency Services, Aerospace Education, Cadet Program), **Leadership and the Cadet Ethic** (Character Development, Physical Fitness, Drill & Ceremonies, Creative Thinking), and **Aerospace Career Exploration** (Career Opportunities, Career Requirements and Counseling). In addition to the nationally mandated curriculum, all cadets will receive (weather permitting) an orientation flight in a Civil Air Patrol aircraft, plus a glider ride. Other highlights include Rappelling, Wall Climbing, Confidence Course, Security Forces demonstration, Cadet Party, Graduation and Awards Ceremony, and a military-style Pass-In-Review parade.

The cost for Basic Cadet Training is \$230. This includes room and board, but *does not* include transportation (carpooling is recommended). Plan to arrive at the Alpena CRTC between 0800 and 1000 on Saturday, July 18, 2009. **Any Basic Cadet planning to arrive before 0800 on the 18<sup>th</sup> must gain prior approval from the Encampment Commander, Maj Jonathan Reid at [reid@miwg.cap.gov](mailto:reid@miwg.cap.gov)**

**IN ORDER TO ATTEND BASIC ENCAMPMENT, CADETS  
MUST HAVE COMPLETED ACHIEVEMENT 1 IN THE CAP CADET PROGRAM.**

## Cadets who HAVE previously attended an encampment may apply for:

**1. Great Lakes Region Cadet Leadership School:** This advanced course is designed to enhance the leadership skills of cadets who have previously attended an encampment. The focus of the course is teamwork, with emphasis on time management, instructional techniques, and attention to detail. Students who complete the course will receive Region Cadet Leadership School credit (meeting the requirements for the Eaker Award). Applicants for Cadet Leadership School **MUST** have completed **Achievement 5** prior to 07 July 09 in order to be eligible to attend, or have written permission from the course director. CLS students must apply by **15 June 09**, and this deadline will be strictly enforced. A homework assignment will be mailed out prior to encampment. Walk-ins will NOT be accepted for Cadet Leadership School. **CLS starts at 1300 on Saturday, 18 July, so all attendees should plan to arrive early on the 18<sup>th</sup> so as not to miss the required 1300 class start.**

The cost for Cadet Leadership School is \$240. This fee includes room and board, *but does not* include transportation (carpooling is recommended). **2. Model Rocketry Encampment:** Now in its seventh year, the Rocketry Encampment will provide advanced aerospace education opportunities to the participants. The program will incorporate the CAPR 50-20, providing the cadet with the opportunity to earn the CAP Model Rocketry Badge. Additionally, cadets will be exposed to educational and career opportunities in the field. This activity will be held during Basic Encampment, and cadets may participate in some activities with the Basic Training Cadets, including physical fitness training, orientation flights, etc. The director will contact each cadet prior to encampment. Rocketry Encampment cadets will be expected to conform to the Encampment S.O.P. A separate graduation ceremony will be held on Friday, July 24, 2009. Senior Member AEOs are also encouraged to attend Rocketry Encampment, in order to bring additional knowledge back to local units. Interested members should contact Lt Col Leo Burke at [lburke@miwg.cap.gov](mailto:lburke@miwg.cap.gov) for more information. Because cadets attending Rocketry Encampment utilize model rocket supplies, the cost for this activity is \$295 to cover those costs.

**3. Cadet Support Staff:** Cadets who chose to serve on support staff work closely with the senior member staff to conduct the various activities during encampment. Cadets can serve in such areas as air operations, public affairs, and communications. Cadets **must have completed a basic encampment to be eligible**. Cadets will be assigned to a support flight with a flight commander, and work in their assigned duties during the day. Cadets must apply to the specific department head they would like to work, and will be selected by that department head. Air ops cadets apply to Maj Rick Thalmann, [rthalmann@miwg.cap.gov](mailto:rthalmann@miwg.cap.gov) (6 maximum), Public Affairs cadets apply to 1<sup>st</sup> Lt Mark Curtis [mcurtis@miwg.cap.gov](mailto:mcurtis@miwg.cap.gov) (2-3 max). Communications cadets may apply to Maj Chuck Cook at [majchuck@gmail.com](mailto:majchuck@gmail.com). Other opportunities may become available, pay attention to wing email lists. All cadets who apply and are accepted into support staff must understand that the needs of the Encampment must come first, and therefore all duty assignments are subject to change.

## Senior Member training opportunities:

We are currently planning on running an SLS, CLC, and TLC during encampment. SLS/CLC will run 17-19 July. Start and end times will be determined and announced at a later date. Cost for these courses will be \$75.00, and will include meals and two nights' lodging. If you are coming to encampment for the entire week, there will be no additional charges. - ◆ Blue, CAP Nameplate

### Battle Dress Uniforms (BDUs)

- ◆ Two (2) BDU Shirts with approved patches and insignia. All officer rank SEWN on.

- ◆ One (1) Belt w/black open face buckle
